## Work Experience

### Milan Baptist Church (Milan, MI)—Youth Pastor

May, 2016—Present

Facilitate the spiritual growth and development of students between the ages of eleven to eighteen-years-old. Assist the head pastor and leadership in leading a church of approximately 200 people. Preach approximately 6-8 times a year. Run four weekly meetings with students (one to a group of 12 in a small group setting, one to a group of 10 with a focus on Bible Education, one to a group of 15-25 in traditional youth group style, and one to a group of 40-70 with a community outreach/evangelism focus). Plan and facilitate multiple events including retreats, conferences, concerts, fun activities, service projects, and an annual mission trip. Lead a team of volunteers, developing their leadership skills, communicating needs, and encouraging their strengths in working with students.

### Faith Baptist Church (Adrian, MI)—Youth Director

July, 2015—April, 2016

Similar to Milan Baptist Church except as a part-time position, and weekly meetings included a Wednesday Night group of 40-50 students (youth group), and a morning Bible Education group of 10-15 students.

### Lenawee Christian School (Adrian, MI)

August, 2013—June, 2015

Elementary Science Lab Coordinator (08/13—06/15), Bible Curriculum & Elementary Liaison of Spiritual Formation (08/14—06/15), & After-Care Provider (08/13—06/14)—aid in the planning and presenting of Science Lab and experiments for all Elementary grades. Provide materials and support for the teachers during lab, as well as leading the instruction of some of the experiments. Partner with faculty and aid in the facilitation of Bible Curriculum and Spiritual Programs. Teach, lead, and speak in chapels. Provide child-care services for children whose parents are not able to pick up their child directly after school. Intentionally invest in the children while creating connections for ministry within the community.

## Impact Day Camps (Adrian, MI)

June, 2010—August, 2015

K-1<sup>st</sup> Grade Leader (06/10—08/12), Athletic Program Coordinator (06/13—08/13), Bible Chaplain (06/14—08/15)—co-lead a group of summer staff overseeing the Kindergarten through First Grade students for a Christian-based Summer Day Camp. Develop daily, themed physical activities and games that correspond with each week’s theme with a biblical tie-in, and coordinate with group leaders and staff to develop a positive experience for each age group. Lead all age groups in worship and biblical study relative to the theme for the week. Oversee the spiritual programming for the entire Summer Camp program.
